**On public holidays,** make sure you check your calendar. Collections may be cancelled **in the event of bad weather.**  
**Door-to-door collections are reserved for normal household activity waste.**



Plastic, metal and composite waste (PMC):  
collection every **2 weeks**



Weekly collection of bags containing house-  
hold waste : **Tuesday**



**REMINDER:**  
Bag weight: 20 kg maximum.



Paper/Cardboard:  
collection every **4 weeks**

If the bag collection date falls on a bank holiday,  
the collection will take place the next working day.

- No broken bags
- No sharp objects
- No electrical & electronic waste
- No hazardous waste
- Statutory communal bag
- No glass

## PLASTIC PACKAGING

## METALLIC PACKAGING



Cans and tins

### Good recycling rules



Drain and empty all packaging properly.



Flatten plastic bottles, replace the cap.



Remove the plastic film from the tray and discard them separately in the bag.



Remove the plastic films that cover the entire bottles and dispose it separately in the blue bag.

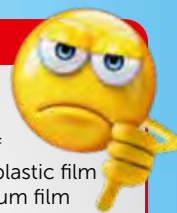
### WHAT IS PROHIBITED IN PMCS

- ✗ Packaging with childproof caps
- ✗ Packaging with at least one of the following symbols



- ✗ Motor oil and lubricant packaging, fuels, pesticides, glue, paints and varnishes, silicone tubes

- ✗ Packaging made of a combination of materials (e.g. plastic film layer + aluminium film layer) which cannot be separated, like some drink, fruit purée or wet pet food pouches etc.



- ✗ Packaging holding more than 8 L

- ✗ Expanded polystyrene



- ✗ Other objects



### CAUTION!



Do not put any packaging inside other packaging and do not group them together in tied up bags (leave them loose in the bag).



Don't attach anything to the outside of the bag.



## Sort your colourless glass bottles and jars!



Colourless glass



Coloured glass



PLEASE dispose of these in the bottle bank or recycling centre

### Comments:



Separate colourless glass from coloured glass.  
Empty properly.



No top or cap.  
Don't leave anything lying around the bottle banks!  
Dumping is subject to sanctions.



## Sort your paper and cardboard!



Door-to-door collection or recycling centre

### Comments:



Remove the plastic film from publications.  
Bundle up your piles of paper and cardboard or place them in the cardboard boxes, ensuring that they are properly closed and don't weigh more than 15 kg.

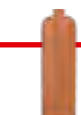

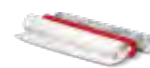

**What does the Green Dot logo mean?** The Green Dot logo on packaging indicates that the company that places the product on the market contributes to the financing of the selective collection, sorting and recycling of household packaging. It says nothing about the recyclability of the product or its packaging and it is not a sorting rule.
